The City Hall doors are on the agenda again. Two quotes are on the table for a decision. Discount Glass \$14,220.01, and Precision Glass and Hardware \$34,889.93. (I have received an updated estimate to include prevailing wage and sales tax rate) \$36,581.86. Discount Glass is to replace the two exterior doors (as stated on Quote). Precision would be two sets of automatic doors, (as stated on quote) the exterior and the interior. The amount in the 2023 budget is \$70,000.00. **Suggested Motion: I move to approve and accept the quote from \_\_\_\_\_ in the amount of \_\_\_\_\_ for the city hall doors and authorize the Mayor to sign applicable documents/contract.**

I have asked the Council to address the subject matter of dissolving the Tonasket Municipal Court again. I have given you additional information. **Suggested Motion: I move to continue with the Tonasket Municipal Court/dissolve the Tonasket Municipal Court.**

I have spoken with James Moore, TVBRC President, and the TVBRC is willing to take on the responsibility of maintaining the sign. **Suggested Motion: I move to approve the Interlocal Agreement with Okanogan County Tourism Council for the building and installation of a Kiosk in the parking lot area of Founders Day Park and the TVBRC.**

One estimate for work has been received for the repairs that need to be completed at the Swim Pool. The quote is from Five Mile Flooring in the amount of \$11,392.50. To clarify, this quote is for labor only. The material will be separate. **Suggested Motion: I move to approve the estimate from Five Mile Flooring in the amount of \$11,392.50 for the labor portion to do the repairs at the Tonasket Swim Pool and authorize the Mayor to sign applicable documents/contract.**

I have received 5 sets of the engineer selection tool that was handed out at the previous Council meeting. After calculating these results, Varela Engineering has 281 points, G & O 179 points. **Suggested Motion: I move to select Varela Engineering as the City of Tonasket's Engineering firm.**

Ordinance #842 would amend Section 2.02.010 of the Tonasket Municipal Code by removing the requirement of confirmation of mayoral appointments by the Council. **Suggested Motion: I move to approve Ordinance #842 as presented.**

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm and the pledge of allegiance was given by all.

Roll Call was taken.

**Motion to excuse Councilmember Weddle.** M/McMillan, S/Hill. Carried 3:0.

**Public Comment:** None.

**Motion to approve the agenda.** M/McMillan, S/Hill. Carried 3:0.

**Kurt Danison Report:**

- Inquired if the Perfect Passage Plan passed last meeting.
- CBDG grant max is now \$2 million.
- Floodplain Plan needs approved.
- Shoreline Master Plan Public Hearing April 18, then goes to Council for Resolution.
- The Planning Commission will be going over the Comp. Plan to keep it up to date.

## MEMO

April 10, 2023

To: Mayor and City Councilmembers

FROM: City Clerk-Treasurer

I am requesting that the Council re-address the subject matter of closing/dissolving Tonasket Municipal Court. I believe that you did not have enough information to base your decision on.

As you can see from the attached documentation the city would save money annually. The cost per ticket is less than what the city is currently spending.

The number of infractions that actually go to court are few, and as you can see on the information, many choose to just pay the ticket instead of going to court. In 2022, there were two people over the age of 70, one from Tennessee and the other from Tonasket that paid in full without going to court.

I do not believe it is a hardship for people that live in the Tonasket area to go to court in Okanogan. Many people drive to Omak-Okanogan area daily or to go shopping.

At this time the court states that we must have a Judge Pro Tem, in case the current judge is unavailable. It seems there are more restrictions put on small courts all of the time which make it harder to be in compliance.

The training that is required is in Vancouver, Washington. Round trip of 810 miles at .655 per mile for \$530.55. The training portion and part of the meals are covered, costs however that would pull our Utility Clerk out of the office for most of a week and there is more valuable training she could be attending.

It is important to mention again that the City would still receive the revenue from the infractions written by the Deputies that work their shifts in Tonasket as part of the County contract, if the Council decided to contract with Okanogan County District Court.

I respectfully ask you to reconsider the previous passed motion to keep the court and to make a motion to dissolve the Tonasket Municipal court.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**  
**WITH OKANOGAN COUNTY TOURISM COUNCIL**

THIS AGREEMENT between the CITY OF TONASKET, a political subdivision of the State of Washington, and the OKANOGAN COUNTY TOURISM COUNCIL.

**WITNESSETH:**

**WHEREAS**, the Okanogan County Tourism Council, a private, nonprofit organization within Okanogan County is seeking to install tourism related information kiosks throughout the county to aid our locals and visitors and the City of Tonasket has requested a kiosk be installed; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tonasket City Council approves the building and installation of the kiosk in the parking lot area of Founders Day Park and the Tonasket Visitor and Business Resource Center; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the parties agree as follows:

1. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this agreement is to establish an understanding between **the Okanogan County Tourism Council** and the City of Tonasket in the realm of the installation and maintenance of an informational kiosk.

2. **SCOPE:** This agreement shall allow the following activities:  
Tourism Council Responsible for: Installation of the kiosk at site determined by the city. Tourism Council is responsible for costs associated with construction of kiosk and sign and replacement of sign or kiosk if needed.

Tonasket Visitor and Business Resource Center will be responsible for: maintaining the sign.

3. **DURATION OF AGREEMENT – TERMINATION:** This agreement shall remain in force until the incident described in this document has ended, or until cancelled by either party in writing.

4. **COMPLIANCE WITH LEGAL REQUIREMENT:** Each party accepts responsibility for compliance with federal, state, or local laws and regulations including, in particular, bidding requirements applicable to its acquisition of goods and services.

5. **FILING:** Executed copies of this agreement shall be filed, or alternatively, listed by subject on the City of Tonasket and Entity's web site or other electronically retrievable public source, as required by Section 39.34.040 of the Revised Code of Washington prior to this agreement becoming effective.

6. **NON-DELEGATION/NON-ASSIGNMENT:** Neither party may delegate the performance of any contractual obligation to a third party, unless mutually agreed in writing. Neither party may assign this agreement without the written consent of the other party.

7. **HOLD-HARMLESS:** The Parties agree that the employee(s)/operator(s) of the City of Tonasket are employees of the City of Tonasket only, and in no way shall be deemed to be employees of the Entity. Each party shall be liable and responsible for the consequence of any negligent or wrongful act or failure to act on the part of itself and its employees, and shall indemnify the other against any damages, claims or causes of action resulting from the Parties performance as required under this agreement, Neither

party assumes responsibility to the other party for the consequences of any act or omission of any person, firm, or corporation not a party to this agreement.

8. SEVERABILITY: Any provision of this agreement, which is prohibited or unenforceable, shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability, without invalidating the remaining provisions or affecting the validity or enforcement of such provisions.

9. VENUE: The Parties agree that in the event that litigation should arise from this agreement, the venue shall lie in Okanogan County, and the prevailing party shall be entitled to recovery of the costs of litigation, including reasonable attorney's fees.

**ORDINANCE NO. 842**

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 2.02.010 of the Tonasket Municipal Code and thereby removing the requirement of confirmation of mayoral appointments by the City Council.

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TONASKET, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN as follows:**

**Section 1.** Section 2.02.010 providing as follows:

The government of the city of Tonasket shall be vested in the mayor, and the city council to consist of five members, and the following appointive officers: a clerk-treasurer, city attorney, chief of police, police court justice, and public works superintendent. The mayor shall have the power of appointment and removal of all appointive officers and employees subject to any applicable law, rule, or regulation relating to civil service. Confirmation of appointments and confirmation of mayoral appointments by the council shall be required. Appointive offices shall be for an indefinite term.

is hereby amended to read as follows:

**The government of the city of Tonasket shall be vested in the mayor, and the city council to consist of five members, and the following appointive officers: a clerk-treasurer, city attorney, chief of police, police court justice, and public works superintendent. The mayor shall have the power of appointment and removal of all appointive officers and employees subject to any applicable law, rule, or regulation relating to civil service. Appointive offices shall be for an indefinite term.**

**Section 2.** This ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage by the council, approval by the Mayor, and publication as required by law.
