Public Comment (Agenda Items)- None.

Motion to approve the revised agenda. M/Weddle, S/McMillan. Carried 4:0.

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. M/McMillan, S/Hill. Carried 4:0.

Public Comment-

Carol Lanigan from The Wild Women of Glass and Sarah Kliegman of Okanogan
Highlands Alliance (OHA) presented the Council with a concept picture of the mosaic art
they would like to place on the outside wall of City Hall, under the library windows.
OHA will fund the project and maintenance of the art.

Motion to allow The Wild Women of Glass to move forward on the project. M/Weddle, S/McMillan. Discussion. Carried 4:0.

Motion to approve the above project contingent on an art agreement and Memorandum of Understanding. M/Hill, S/McMillan. Carried 4:0.

Travis Hilkey used a map from the City dated 2010 to show the existing water lines and spigots at the airport. He added a line and a spigot between his and 3 other hangers. He was asked to cut it because he didn't have approval. He and Lee Orr would like the Council to look into this because of the 8 existing spigots and approve him putting in one more for irrigation and fire protection. They would also like clarification on the City's responsibilities and the Airport Improvement Clubs responsibilities at the airport.

EV Charging Solutions-

Charlie Botsford from EV Charging Solutions gave an overview of what they do and what the City will get if they get approved for the grant for the ev charging stations. Tonasket would receive two quick charging stations that each have two car chargers. The City will not be charged for any expenses incurred. They will install, maintain, pay the power bill and pay rent for the spot. They just need a letter of intent to add Tonasket to the grant.

Motion to approve the City of Tonasket sign a letter of intent to EV Charging Solutions for charging stations to be placed in a location to be determined at a later date. M/Weddle, S/Alexander. Carried 3:1. McMillan voted no.

Public Hearing-

This meeting has been advertised as a Public Hearing on the Shoreline Master Program update, which includes amendments to the Comprehensive Plan and Chapter 18.08 TMC. The purpose of the hearing is to consider public comments on the proposed amendments to the Comprehensive Plan and Chapter 18.08 TMC as required by the Department of Ecology. Mayor Maldonado opened the public hearing at 7:19 pm and handed it over to Planner Danison. Planner Danison presented the staff report. There were no questions or comments.

Picatti has completed the well project. There was an additional \$345.00 for some wire that was not included in the original quote. The original quote was \$23,392.60, with the addition of \$345 the final amount is \$23,766.94. Suggested Motion: I move to authorize payment to Picatti Bros in the amount of \$21,390.25 (which is less 10%) then when all applicable paperwork has been received, the final payment of \$2,376.69 will be paid, which in turn approves the additional cost of \$345.00 plus tax.

Five Mile Flooring has completed the work at the swim pool. The original quote was for labor only, in the amount of \$10,500, plus tax of \$892.50=\$11,392.50. Additional time was needed, \$1250.00, and material, \$2,540.00 making the final amount due, \$15,504.65. Suggested Motion: I move to authorize payment to Five Mile Flooring in the amount of \$13,954.18 (which is less 10%) then when all applicable paperwork has been received, the final payment of \$1,550.47 will be paid, which in turn approves the additional costs of \$1,250.00 and \$2,540.00 plus tax.

Attached you will find the current Airport Land Lease and a list of items from the Airport Committee.

Six Year Transportation Improvement Plan public hearing will be held at the regular City Council meeting on June 27th. Kurt has sent a list and I have included the list of our current STIP projects in priority order. Please review and have your priorities for the June 13 meeting.

Annually, the opening day of the pool is a free swim day. Last year the opening day and the annual BBQ were the same day. This year that is not the case. The BBQ will be on July 15th. I suggest that also be a free swim day. Suggested Motion: I move to have a free swim day at the Tonasket Community Pool on opening day June 12th, 2023 and July 15th, 2023.

The Forest Service has suggested the city enter into an agreement for use of the Tonasket Airport for air support during fire season. (The agreement attached is not correct.) Will be bringing the correct agreement to Council. Suggested Motion: I move to approve the agreement with the USDA – FS for use of the Tonasket Airport.

For your information, I have included a traffic report for the time period when the City had use of the County's portable speed sign. (I have not given up on finding a portable speed sign for the City to have permanently.)

TONASKET AIRPORT LAND LEASE

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this day of
,, by and between the CITY OF TONASKET, a
municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Lessor", and
hereinafter designated as the "Lessee".
WITNESSETH:
WHEREAS, the Lessor is the owner of the Tonasket Municipal Airport located Northwest of the City of Tonasket; and
WHEREAS, the Lessee desires to lease the property on which a hangar is located or will be constructed,
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES as follows:
1. For and in consideration of the rents and covenants herein specified to
be kept and performed by the parties hereto, the Lessor does hereby lease and
demise to the said Lessee that parcel of real property situated on the Tonasket
Municipal Airport in Section 8, Township 37 North, Range 27 E.W.M. located in
the County of Okanogan, State of Washington, as shown and depicted as
Hangar Site Nowith the lot size of 50' x 60', on the drawing attached hereto
as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference as fully set forth.
2. Lessee is hereby leasing said land for the purpose of maintaining a

hangar.

- 3. Rent is \$270 per year, plus all applicable local, state, and federal taxes, paid in advance. Said rental payment shall be subject to periodic adjustment by the City of Tonasket as adopted by Resolution. In addition thereto, the **Lessee** shall be responsible for the payment of any and all utilities provided to the premises.
- 4. It is further understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the **Lessee** will maintain the premises and any improvements thereon in good condition, both inside and outside, and will not allow the same to deteriorate unduly, reasonable wear and tear excepted, so that said hangar will at all times during this lease period be maintained in a reasonably good condition so that it will not in any way be detrimental to the appearance or safety of the airport. Areas between hangars will be the responsibility of the hangar owner for graveling and weed control.
- 5. It is agreed and understood by and between the parties hereto that the **Lessee** shall have the right to use taxiways for ingress and egress to reach the runway and other facilities located at the airport. Said taxiways as described shall not be used exclusively by the **Lessee** and may be used by an individual authorized to do so by the **Lessor**.
- 6. It is further agreed and understood that the **Lessee** has the right to sublease the property above described that he is leasing without the written consent of the **Lessor**.

- 7. It is agreed and understood that the **Lessee** shall indemnify and agree to hold the **Lessor** harmless for any operations or activities or injuries, damage or liabilities arising from any of the **Lessee's** operations relative to his hangar, or otherwise, or any other operation, which he may conduct on said leased premises, or in any way connected with his operation on the premises.
- 8. It is agreed and understood that the **Lessee** shall not be engaged in any activity, which would unnecessarily increase the fire hazard or other risk at the airport. The storage of fuel on or about the premises is strictly prohibited. **Lessee** shall not use the site for maintenance purposes other than to perform those preventative maintenance items allowed by the FAA to be performed by aircraft owners.
- 9. **Lessee** agrees to observe and obey all rules and regulations of the city, state, federal government and any governmental agency including, but not necessarily limited to, the Federal Aviation Administration.
- 10. The **Lessor**, its agents and employees shall have the right to enter upon the premises and any hangars located thereon in the event of emergency, which requires said entry.
- 11. **Lessee**, its customers, passengers, guests and other invitees shall have at all times the full and free right of ingress and egress to and from the premises.

12. Lessee will maintain in force and carry at his expense at all times during the terms of this agreement, liability insurance in the amount of \$500,000.00 or more. Lessor shall be furnished with copies of all such insurance policies obtained by Lessee in compliance with this section. Lessee agrees to notify Lessor in writing as to any amendment or cancellation of such policies.

If **Lessee** fails to keep and perform any of the covenants and agreements herein contained, the **Lessor** may cancel this lease at its option and re-enter and claim the said premises and any improvements thereon. **Lessee** may elect at any time to terminate this agreement by giving 30 days' written notice to **Lessor**.
- 15. The parties agree that in the event of litigation to enforce any of the covenants or conditions of this lease, the prevailing party will, in addition to any other sums found to be due in such litigation, be entitled to recover as costs such sum as the court may adjudge as reasonable attorney's fees.

16. It is fully agreed and understood by and between the parties thereto that this lease shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, executors, assigns and administrators and successors in interest. **EXECUTED** on this date ______. 

Volume by Speed




