## Sample Modification to Section 23 of Tonasket Council Rules

# **Council Standing Committees**

The procedures governing the appointment and operation of all committees of the Council shall be as follows:

(a) It shall be the responsibility of the Mayor to appoint Councilmembers to Council Standing Committees at the second regular meeting of the Council in January, or at a meeting soon thereafter, or otherwise as vacancies occur. Prior to such appointments Councilmembers may state their preference for the committees on which they prefer to serve. Each committee shall consist of two members, and it shall be a priority when possible that at least one member of each committee shall be a reappointment to the committee on which he or she served during the previous year. Every Councilmember shall serve on at least one committee.

(Also consider adding: All such appointments shall require confirmation by the Council.)

- (b) Each committee shall establish its own meeting times.
- (c) Special Ad Hoc Committees for a particular purpose may be established and appointed by the Council or the Mayor, along with a clear task description and duration of project.
- (d) Committees may make recommendations, when appropriate, on proposed ordinances, resolutions and motions within their area of responsibility, before action is taken by the Council.

# A resolution declaring certain property to be surplus to the City.
